CALLED COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
January 27, 2006

Council Member Hadden was not present.

Mayor Jenkins called the meeting to order and stated that this was a special called meeting to discuss annexations between the City of Doraville and the proposed City of Dunwoody.

Mayor Jenkins stated that he and several Council Members had viewed the property and most of it looked good. There are approximately 2,200 residents that live in the apartments and condos. Mayor Jenkins asked how many Police Officers and Code Enforcement Officers it would take to patrol that area.

Acting Chief McElroy stated the Police Department was waiting for call data. It will take approximately four Officers to cover the area but until the call data comes back, the number of Officers needed is still unknown.

Council Member Hart asked how many Officers was the City short right now. Acting Chief McElroy stated that he had one Officer in the academy and another would start in March.

Council Member Spangler asked how long the Police Department would be short of Officers. Acting Chief McElroy stated that the City will be short two Officers for the next several months.

Council Member Lowe wanted to know if Doraville would be stuck with the property if Dunwoody did not become a City. The answer was no the annexations would be on the same legislation as the Dunwoody Charter. If the bill failed, there would be no annexations.

Robert Drake, a Transportation Engineer gave a brief update on the boundaries for the proposed City of Dunwoody.

Council Member Spangler asked what the time frame was for the proposed annexations and the creation of the City of Dunwoody. Mr. Drake stated that the bill has gone to the State Legislators and if approved then the proposed City of Dunwoody would be on the June Primary ballot.

Council Member Spangler asked who was paying for the boundary survey and the draft legislation that would be going before the State House and Senate. Mr. Drake stated that the money was coming from private donations.

Council Member Anavitarte made a motion to approve in theory the proposed map, composed by Senator Weber, and support the creation of the City of Dunwoody. Council Member Pittman seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Jenkins adjourned the meeting.
