WHY SPAY & NEUTER?

One female dog, if not spayed, could potentially result in the birth of 4,372 puppies in seven years. This is assuming she and each of her subsequent female pups reproduce once a year at an average rate of 4 pups to a litter with 2 females in each litter—a conservative estimate since dogs are capable of breeding twice a year. It is true that some female puppies will not live long enough to breed. However, many of those who do breed will have more frequent and larger litters than the average. Also, the surviving male puppies will be responsible for many more puppies.

Cats, on the other hand, usually have three litters per year with an average of 3 to 5 kittens per litter. Frequently, six and even seven kittens will be produced in a litter.

These figures are staggering when you consider the number of families actively adopting pets. The problem is that there are far too many dogs and cats that must be put down because they are unwanted. You have the solution—stop breeding unwanted pets.

- Have your female/male dogs and cats spayed/neutered by six months.
- Never give away an unsplayed/unneutered female/male dog or cat.
- Never abandon any animal.

Please SPAY or NEUTER – otherwise, Life could mean early Death for many animals.
