# PET OWNERS

Before any personal pets are allowed in the City of Doraville, each must be vaccinated against rabies. This is county as well as city law. The tag must be attached to a secure collar on all dogs, cats and ferrets. The rabies tag contains owner information including a current phone number where the owner may be reached. It is imperative to have a contact number where the owner may be reached if the animal has (1) been found at large; (2) been injured; (3) bitten someone; or (4) bitten another animal.



Responsibility rests solely on the owner's shoulders. The Animal Control Ordinance specifically attests to the rights and responsibilities you have as a pet owner. Your responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Medical treatment for your pet;
- 2) Current vaccinations for your pet;
- 3) Rabies inoculation and tags for your pet; and,
- 4) Preventing your pet from becoming a nuisance to neighbors. Nuisances include, but are not limited to, (a) running at large; (b) barking; (c) improper disposal of fecal matter; and (d) breeding.

Each household within the City of Doraville is allowed to maintain a maximum of three domestic animals on the property. Breeding (of any kind of animal) is NOT permitted within any subdivision of the City of Doraville.

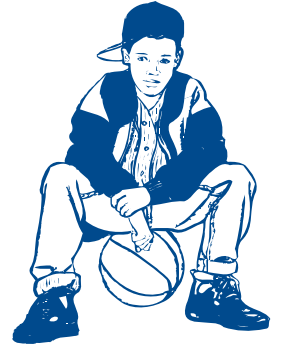
