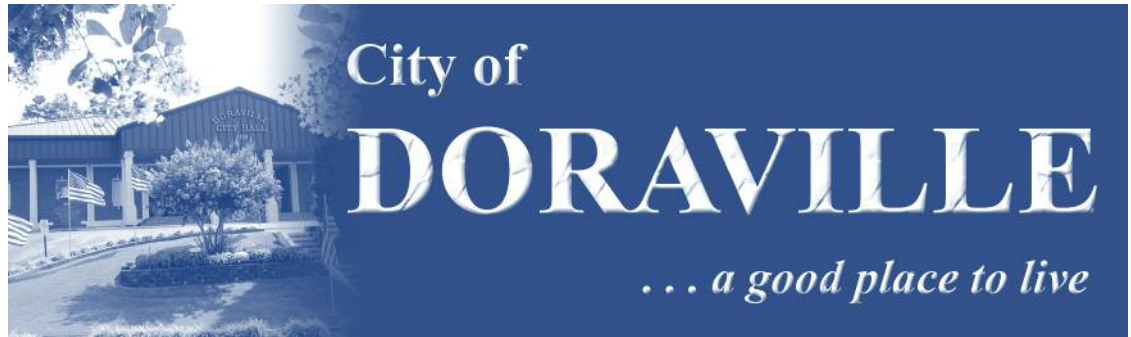

Dear Citizens,

On April 7, a disturbing theft took place in the Northwoods area, a theft that was coercive in nature and aimed at an elderly couple. On this day, a young couple conned their way into the victims' residence under the guise of "Larry and Lisa Jones." The "Joneses," who arrived in a dark red van, claimed to be siblings and the children of a deceased individual named Demetrius Jones, a man who was once a close neighbor of the victims.

The younger couple asked to come in for a visit and the victims graciously and unsuspectingly invited them in. After some casual conversation, "Mr. Jones" asked to use the restroom while "Ms. Jones" continued chatting with the victims. After noticing that "Mr. Jones" was taking too long in the bathroom, the husband made his way to the back and caught "Jones" walking out of their bedroom.

After talking some more, the young couple left but not before promising to reimburse the elderly couple \$40, a payment that "Jones" said was warranted because he borrowed electricity from an outside socket to power tools and equipment. "Mr. Jones" promised to come back the next day but never showed up. It was then that the victims noticed that they had \$400 missing from their bedroom.

This is an appalling crime, but unfortunately it's not uncommon. Every day thieves and con artists prey on elderly citizens, and I want to take this opportunity to warn others. I would also like to ask citizens to be on the lookout for this couple and others like them. Remember, staying vigilant and working together are the best remedies for crime prevention.

The Doraville Police Department would like to announce plans for the first Junior Citizen Police Academy. With the continued success of the Citizen Police Academy, the staff would like to offer a similar experience for interested teens within the community.

The Junior Citizen Police Academy is scheduled for the week of July 14-18 from 8:00 am until 3:00 pm for teens between 13 and 17 years of age. Teens must be enrolled in school and be good citizens in the community. Students must attach a letter of recommendation to be considered for the academy. The letter can be from a police officer, principal, teacher, counselor, pastor, coach or director of a recreation center.

The Junior Academy is an educational program designed to give young men and women a working knowledge of law enforcement. The comprehensive training will cover different topics every day. The topics are designed to educate and open the lines of communication between students and parents on tough issues that teens deal with in today's society.

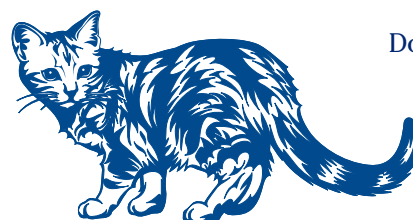

Working Together

Most of us love and care for our pets. Let's face it, they are our children, and we will go to great lengths to protect them. We are faced with a dilemma when our cats stray off our property. This is the nature of the feline, to explore and "hunt" for food and other cats. Problems arise when they become a nuisance to other neighbors by their behavior. The feline is a territorial creature and we owe much to their ability to catch mice, rats and other creatures we just don't want to invade our homes. The conflict that arises is when these cats defecate on our lawns and driveways, making a nuisance of themselves away from their owner's property. This is where the Animal Control Ordinance prevails. The Animal Control and Services Department has the legal authority to set traps and to capture any creature which becomes a nuisance to any citizen of Doraville. Tampering with these traps, either to release an animal or to use the trap without prior consent of the Animal Control and Services Department, is not legal. In your supposed kindness, you are breaking the law.

There is a process where the captured animal is photographed and returned to the owner by the Rabies tag. This is one of the main reasons to abide by the law and have your cats, dogs and even ferrets vaccinated. Cats that spend most of their time outdoors need this protection.

This Rabies inoculation protects not only your cat but also you, your children and your neighbors. Our law stipulates that when bitten by a cat with no form of Rabies inoculation, the cat **MUST** be captured and tested for Rabies. Tampering with City traps will lengthen the time of this test and endanger lives.
